KING DAVID

Is the growing interest among people exploring their family history only by older people or is it because the internet has made the process easier?

In Old Testament Foundations, we have seen God's people down the generations. We have considered Adam, Abraham, Moses

and Joshua and jumped over the book of Judges with Deborah, Gideon and Samson. All these died before we reach King David. But three living characters in today's story are Samuel the prophet, Saul the King and David the future King.

David was the youngest of eight sons of Jesse. Think of different stages of his life:

Shepherd: "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep" I Samuel I6:11. God had guided Samuel to invite Jesse and his sons to a feast. Seven sons were there, but not David. Samuel asked the question "Are these all your sons?" I wonder what tone of voice Jesse used in his reply.

Anointed: *"Rise and anoint him; for this is the one"* 1 Samuel 16:12 Samuel knew he was going to anoint one of Jesse's sons as a future King, but not which one. It is likely that others present didn't know the implications of this anointing.

Musician: *"I have seen a son of Jesse the Bethlehemite, who is skilful in playing"* 1 Samuel 16:18

David played the lyre (a small harp). Saul was still King but troubled by an evil spirit. David was introduced into the royal household to play and soothe the King.

Champion: "You come with sword and spear and javelin, but I come to you in the name of the LORD of hosts" I Samuel; 17:45. David's words facing Goliath's challenge. His experience as a shepherd fighting lions and bears prepared him for this challenge.

Fugitive: "David rose and fled that day from Saul" I Samuel 21:10 Saul was angry that women were praising David more than himself and was jealous of David. Several chapters tell of David's escapades as he fled from Saul. His outdoor life as a shepherd would be good preparation for his time in the wilderness.

King: "...and they anointed David king over all Israel" 2 Samuel 5:3 This was a public anointing in contrast to the previous private anointing. God had used his previous experiences to prepare him for this.

The New Testament begins with family history. It is "*the* genealogy of Jesus the Messiah, the son of David" St. Matthew 1:1. David was a preview of Jesus, also born at Bethlehem. Thanks for David. Thanks for Jesus.
