2 Corinthians 3. 17-18



Washed to Shine

Do you remember your baptism? I don't. There is a certificate, a few black and white photos and the infamous cinefilm. This does not show any of the service but features my elder brother being taken outside to have a pee against the church as it had no inside toilets. It then pans around the guests leaving church all in their finest, most of whom I have absolutely no idea who they were.

Some people may have been old enough when they were baptised that they could remember it and how meaningful it was. At the age of 17, when I made a decision for myself to follow Jesus, I asked my vicar if I could be baptised as an adult as a public declaration of my new found faith. He refused as I was 'done' as a baby and I grudgingly accepted Confirmation as an alternative.

When we were going through the Nicene Creed, we did not have time to fit in: '*We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.*' It was this statement and Bible teaching (e.g. Ephesians 4.5: 'one Lord, one faith, one baptism') that makes clear there is only ONE baptism. This baptism is to proclaim that through Jesus, we have been forgiven.

Baptism is an outward sign of what God is doing on the inside.

Water is a symbol for life and cleansing. As in Romans 6. 3-4, there is a sense that, in going down into the water, we identify with Christ's death so as to receive new life in Him. Water may go on the outside of the body, but our unseen God cleanses us as our sins are forgiven and makes us new in Jesus. We are a new creation (2 Corinthians 5.17). Like dirty, well-used coins cleaned in vinegar, God's washing of us causes us to shine like new. And like those clean coins, we reflect the light of Jesus. He is the source of light. It is His light and glory that shines to others through us. By reflecting the light of Jesus something profound happens to us in turn. We are slowly, '*from one degree of glory to another*', being transformed to be more like Jesus (2 Corinthians 3. 17-18).

Baptism is also about belonging. Baptism shows publicly that we are part of Christ's body, the church, and we belong to Him. It is often referred to as a 'Christening'. This English word is derived from the Greek for 'into Christ' or coming into God's family. Through baptism, we come into Christ and belong to Him.

As we think of baptism washing us to make us shine, maybe we should look over those baptismal promises made for us or by ourselves and ask Jesus to cleanse us more so that we can become more and more like Him.

Do you turn away from sin?
Do you reject evil?
Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?
Do you trust in Him as Lord?

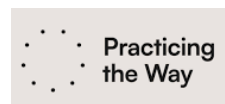
