

CONTINUING ACTS

20th July 2025

Acts 28. 16-31



Today we conclude our series looking at the Acts of Apostles. 16 sermons have been preached in this series. Our focus has been around growth.

The church grew because the followers of Jesus devoted themselves to prayer and they were open to receive the gift of the Spirit.

When the Spirit came upon them in Acts 2, they came out of hiding, rushed into the streets and proclaimed Jesus as Lord and Saviour. We looked at the different sermons preached by the apostles and what was common or core to these messages - most notably the death and resurrection of Jesus. We read of the followers praying for boldness to proclaim Jesus when opposition and later persecution came their way. We learnt of the generosity that was central to the life of the early church. We saw how, through prayer, 7 deacons were chosen when a dispute broke out in the early church over widows from outside Israel who were being overlooked as food was shared among believers. We studied all the healing stories done in the name of Jesus in Acts and saw both Peter and Paul being credited with praying to see the dead raised. And all the time the Gospel message was being preached. Firstly to the Jews, but then, partly though persecution forcing the disciples away from Jerusalem and partly through revelation as Peter was shown that 'all people are clean' (Acts 10 v 15), to the Gentiles (non-Jews). Barriers were broken down and boundaries were crossed as the Gospel spread. The early church was growing as it was constantly looking to Jesus and moving outwards.

In all this, we saw the words of Jesus being fulfilled. Jesus said in Acts 1.8: "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Today we come the end of Acts. Paul arrives in the heart of the known world - Rome itself. As a result of God's crazy plans, he arrived under guard appealing to Caesar as a Roman citizen and under house arrest. Yet he was given freedom for 2 years to welcome all who came to him. He welcomes first the Jews of Rome who were curious about this 'sect' (28.22). As might be expected, he gets a mixed response, which prompts him to quote the prophet Isaiah to them.

And that is where it ends, with Paul 'proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance' (v.31). However the reality is that Acts does not end. The same Spirit continues to work through the church and the church continues to grow to the ends of the earth.

What has struck you most from our study of Acts? What are you applying to your life? How are you proclaiming Jesus with boldness and without hindrance?
