Isaiah 7. 10-16



Mary and Joseph

Were you ever in a school nativity play? There are often a few made-up characters for children to play because not everyone can be chosen to play Mary and Joseph. But have you ever wondered why Mary and Joseph were chosen to be the parents of the Son of God?



If we look at the different family trees of Jesus in Luke and in Matthew, we see that the two join together at King David. Joseph's line follows the line of the kings of Israel through David's son Solomon while Mary's line continues through David's other son Nathan. It was prophesied that the Messiah would be from David's line, so the first reason they were chosen might have been that they were both descended from King David.

What other reasons were there to choose **Mary**? She was a young girl, a teenager who was engaged to be married and she was a virgin. Her virginity was so important that we refer to her as the 'Virgin Mary'. Her virginity speaks of her character and purity. Her virginity fulfilled the prophecy from our first reading from Isaiah, that 'a virgin will be with child and will bear a son...' A miraculous conception brought about by God to show that her child would be the Son of God.

The angel Gabriel also called her 'highly favoured'. The qualities which God found favourable in this teenage girl would become even more apparent in the future: her humility, faith, courage, obedience, her compassion and her love and support of her Son.

But Mary was not the only one chosen by God. Why was Joseph chosen?

Joseph is often overlooked and seems to have a minor part in the story of Jesus' birth. After all he was not the father of Jesus, and it would be easy to think that only Mary and Jesus mattered. He was a poor carpenter, but he was chosen by God to be the earthly father in His place, to love, care for, and protect Mary and God's Son and to nurture Jesus as he grew.

Matthew 1:19 tells us that he was a righteous man. He also had a deep faith and love of God, who seemed to communicate to Joseph through dreams. After each of the 4 dreams that Joseph had around the birth of Jesus, we read that he acted immediately in obedience to what God told him to do. It can't have been easy to be a father to this special child, but we

know that Joseph brought Jesus up in the ways of his people; every year Joseph took the family on pilgrimage to celebrate Passover in Jerusalem.

But what about us? Throughout the Bible, we read how God chose people for specific tasks. Since Pentecost God now pours out His Spirit on everybody who turns to Christ, no longer just for specific tasks but to help us tell others about Jesus.

We have been chosen by God. So let's serve God and His purposes as readily as Mary and Joseph.
