ADVENT 2 SUNDAY: We look for the resurrection of the dead...



Someone once noticed that next door to 'Pleck Boxing Club' was 'The Body Repair Shop'! Presumably it was for car bodies rather than human bodies. Not because they have been boxing, but because they are getting older, some people might need a body repair shop (usually provided by NHS!).



A new body:

It is good news for Christians that ultimately we will be provided with a new body. We receive this as the creed puts it at 'the resurrection of the dead'. What will it be like? Contrasts between our present body and new body are described in 1 Corinthians 15:42-44:

- ... sown as **perishable** raised as **imperishable**
- ... sown in **dishonour** raised in **glory**
- ... sown in **weakness** raised in **power**
- ... sown a physical raised a spiritual

This is illustrated as we sow a seed which dies and something much more beautiful or fruitful than the individual seed grows. We get a little glimpse of what it might be like from Christ's resurrection body.

A new creation:

That body will live not in the present world but in 'a new heaven and a new earth' (Revelation 21:1). This and chapter 22 mentions some things which will be 'no more' in that new creation. These include the sea (depicting evil – think of the devastation it can cause), death, mourning, pain, curse and night. Some of this is also reflected in Isaiah 65 from verse 17 onwards which also describes what is there including joy, permanence and blessing.

Between our death and the new body and new creation we go to be with Christ. Jesus said so to the thief on the cross and St. Paul longed to be 'with Christ which is far better'. This is difficult to grasp as there is no time in eternity. But even now 'time' can vary. As you look forward to Christmas you may have many things to do and time goes so fast. But as children

look forward to Christmas and the prospect of presents on Christmas Day, time goes ever so slowly. But it is the same number of days and hours.

Meanwhile, it is good to find out more about where we will spend eternity with that new body in that new creation. The Bible is where to look. But remember, as a former Australian Archbishop once put it, "Scripture reveals facts we need to know rather than things we may want to know". That is a way 'we look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come'.
